TASTING NOTES

La Scorie is a Rhone-style blend inspired by the supple, dark fruit driven symphony of Grenache, Syrah and Petit Sirah. Beautiful complexity with notes of plum and blackberry, dark roast coffee, spicy notes of nutmeg, allspice, subtle black peppercorn. A nice concentration with medium bodied tannins.

VINEYARD NOTES

The Columbia Valley vineyards where this vintage was sourced are located in a vast, diverse, and arid wine region in Washington State. This area is characterized by hot, dry summers and cool, dry winters, which create a continental high desert climate. The region features sandy, windblown soils that were well-drained by the Missoula Floods, making it an ideal location for viticulture.
